

## Club Bluenote

Club Bluenote opened sometime in 1959 by Al Steiner on the second floor of 372½ Yonge St. Advertising in the usual places was irregular at best so this list is framed in a way it appears many do, by the house band. Using information from Rob Bowman and Daniel Tate's *The Flyer Vault*, Mark Doble and Frank Troiano's book *Domenic Troiano, His Life and Music*, various Facebook posts, with some dates tightened up using what could be found in the popular press, the house bands were:

Bobby Dean and the Gems 1959-Oct 1960 (Bobby Dean Blackburn, Jack Snow, Glen White, Bob Lenghall, Rod Campbell, Roger Farr as ID'd in an article announcing a Star Fund benefit at Club Trocadero - Star Dec 8<sup>th</sup> 1959 p.8

Kay Taylor and the Regents to August 1962

Steve Kennedy and the Silhouettes to either Sept 13<sup>th</sup> or 20<sup>th</sup>, 1964

Whitey and the Roulettes to December 1964

The Rogues to April 1965

The Peepers to the spring of 1967

The Statlers until the end of 1969 when the Club closed, with the Messengers appearing Oct/68 to March 69

In practice the amount of advertising was probably a function of need. As long as we came in sufficient numbers, advertising wasn't needed.
